

Phase 1 COVID-19 Vaccine Now Available for All Eligible Alliance Group Care Members

Alameda Alliance for Health (Alliance) values our dedicated provider partner community. We would like to share this important update about the COVID-19 vaccine with you.

Alliance Group Care Members:

Alameda County Public Health (ACPHD) has contracted with Community Health Center Network (CHCN) to administer the COVID-19 vaccine for all eligible Alliance Group Care members. Beginning in January 2021, all eligible Alliance Group Care members can receive the COVID-19 vaccine from any available CHCN Clinic location as a part of the Alameda County vaccine plan during Phase 1a. Please see the enclosed list for available locations, and let your Group Care patients know that they can make an appointment with CHCN by visiting https://chcnetwork.org/covid-19-resources/ and call 1.510.297.0499 if they need assistance. The Alliance will also send the enclosed member communication to all eligible Group Care members to help keep them informed.

Alternatively, if you have the COVID-19 vaccine available to give to patients, you may also provide it to an assigned eligible Alliance Group Care member, and the Alliance will reimburse you for the administration of the vaccine in accordance with the table below, as determined by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS):

Important Update: Phase 1 COVID-19 Vaccine Now Available for All Eligible Alliance Group Care Members

Thank you for choosing the Alameda Alliance for Health (Alliance) as your health plan. We are here to help you stay healthy, safe, and strong. As your partner in health, we are sending you this update to inform you that the COVID-19 Vaccine is now available for all eligible Alliance Group Care members, as a part of the Alameda County COVID-19 vaccine plan during Phase 1a.

You can now schedule an appointment to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, at no cost to you, from any of the available Community Health Center Network (CHCN) clinic locations. **Please see the enclosed list for available locations**.

If you are not a current patient at a CHCN health center, the simplest way to request an appointment to get the COVID-19 vaccine at the CHCN clinic of your choice is to log onto the CHCN COVID-19 Resource Page (https://chcnetwork.org/covid-19-resources/). If you need additional assistance requesting an appointment, you can call CHCN at 1.510.297.0499.

Current patients of a CHCN health center can contact them directly for an appointment. Only Group Care members not assigned to CHCN health centers will be able to register in this way so please do not share this letter with anyone else.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Are COVID-19 vaccines safe?

Yes. Safety information about the vaccines has been reviewed and approved by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Food and Drug Administration (FDA), and the Western States Scientific Review Committee (California, Oregon, and Washington).

Which vaccines are available?

There are two vaccines currently available: one from Moderna and one from Pfizer. Both have shown to be 94-95% effective and both require two doses, given about three weeks apart. Based on currently available data, the CDC and California Department of Public Health advises that both doses are required for complete protection.

Is the vaccine mandatory?

No, there is no requirement from the state or federal government. This is an individual decision, and we hope to share the best available information to help people make the right choice for themselves.

Who will get vaccinated and in what order?

Alameda County is following the State's prioritization framework, which is based on the CDC's recommendations and *is evolving*. Vaccine administration began in Alameda County the week of 12/14/20. - Vaccines are being administered in phases. How quickly we can move through each
 phase depends on how much vaccine is available. Local health departments have some
 control within the phases but cannot skip phases or go out of order. All phases are
 subject to revision by the State.
- Each Phase is broken down further into Tiers to help prioritize within each phase. For example, Phase 1b Tier 1 includes Essential Workers in education/childcare and food/agriculture; and Phase 1b Tier 2 includes Essential Workers in transportation and manufacturing.

This framework is subject to change, as the State is considering moving to an age-based framework.

Current Vaccine Prioritization Framework updated 1/13/21

What does this mean for me?

- Vaccine supply is limited. Distribution is being prioritized by groups of people based on their risk of exposure to - or becoming severely ill from - the virus that causes COVID-19.
 Prioritization criteria include occupation, age, living and health conditions.
- Where you fall within a phase depends on multiple factors, including your role and duties at your job. If you are at higher risk of being exposed to the virus because of how you interact with the public or if you are at higher risk of spreading the virus to others, you will be prioritized earlier.
- Hundreds of thousands of people are in Phase 1, and we will likely not complete this
 phase until the Spring.
- As supply increases, it will be offered to more and more people but that will take several months.

Do I need to wear a mask after I'm vaccinated?

Yes. The vaccine will protect you from developing severe illness, but it may not stop you from spreading COVID-19 to others. Until we get enough people vaccinated to protect our entire community, it is critical that everyone—even those who have been vaccinated—continue to wear masks and follow other COVID-19 prevention guidance.

What should I do while I wait to be vaccinated?

Please continue to follow the prevention guidelines you've heard about since the pandemic started:

- Wear a face covering
- Keep at least six feet of distance from anyone you don't live with
- Wash your hands often
- Stay home if sick
- Avoid gatherings
